ESE

"And now these three remain: faith, hope and love." 1 Corinthians 13:13a

For any faithful Protestant, and Catholic, too, it is understood that our salvation and relationship with God is bound in the eternal gift of faith. It is one of the apostle Paul's three eternal gifts from God according to 1 Corinthians 13:13. We know all what Paul said about the power of faith throughout all his letters. Faith has many different meanings as used by Paul. In his book, <u>Paul and the Language of Faith</u>, Nijay Gupta, lists three distinct understandings of faith that are often used interchangeably.

First, there is faith that is "obeying faith". That is, "faithfulness" or "loyalty." Philippians and 1 Thessalonians emphasizes this dimension of faith, according to Gupta.

Second, the word "faith" can mean "believing faith." This is an understanding of faith that distinguishes our belief and the ways of the world, as opposed to our belief in the promises in the kingdom of God. It is our faith in God, as opposed to human institutions, that empowers such faith.

Third, the term "faith" can mean for Gupta a "trusting faith." It is this faith that helps us in our Christian walk. As we seek to live as Christians in the world, we have a trusting faith in the promises of God and that the purposes of God shall be fulfilled. This empowers our living as Christians.

As Christians in modernity, we are able to focus on our unity in God through Jesus Christ in faith that enables us to overcome the divisions that now exist. The promises of God are that these divisions will not endure. Division will not define the Christian church. Our faith unifies us as we rely first and foremost (and ultimately solely), in the presence and power of God.

For our particular church, it is through faith that we have come to believe that God is leading us towards the development of a new worship space. This worship space will empower us to proclaim such faith and enable our congregants and community to grow in strength and stature, as did our Lord. Developing a new worship space is an enormous undertaking, yet the risk of not doing so results in us not sharing of our faith to the world in which we live.

Thus, Paul says "Faith, Hope and Love." Let us focus on our faith in God, for it is by faith that we are saved. It is in faith that we realize our hope, a hope that will not disappoint us. And it is in true faith that we are able to love one another and live without fear. It is John who reminds us that perfect love casts out all fear.

Will you help our Children's Ministry?

I am reaching out in faith that God – and you – our faithful congregation, will provide for several pressing needs concerning our ministry to children. These needs must be met in order to continue in our service to the young people in this community.

Our church children numbers are increasing. We are looking for additional teen workers, Sunday School teachers and bus drivers:

<u>Teen Workers:</u> High school and college age students to **assist teachers with our children's ministry** on Sunday mornings and Wednesday afternoons.

<u>Sunday School Teachers:</u> for Sunday morning Children's Church, during the 10:00am service, following "Time for Young Disciples". Children's Church is held in the Preschool classrooms. Lesson material is provided. You can work one or more Sundays per month, your choice. We schedule monthly based on your schedule.

Bus Drivers: Scheduled monthly based on your schedule. Our drivers are needed Wednesdays between 3:00 and 4:00pm to transport students from local elementary schools to FPC for our **Quest Program**. Another adult is on the bus to manage the kids so the driver may concentrate on driving.

Worship

Deacons and Elders at FirstPresVero

Every religious denomination develops its own way of administration and ministering. In PC/USA, the Ruling Elders are Session- nominated, congregation-elected, ordained and installed. The Elders operate within the body called "Session". At First Pres Vero, Session meets once a month. In between meetings the Elders are very active on Teams, Pillars and Committees with the administration of the Church, under the guidance of the Teaching Elder, the Pastor, who is also Moderator of Session.

Elders are the governing board of the church. They are responsible for the spiritual and physical oversight of the church, including worship, mission, money and education.

Deacons are also elected by the congregation, ordained and installed by the Minister. They, too, meet monthly as the body called the Diaconate. Deacons have a ministry of service, to the congregation and to the wider world. Their remit is one of mission: preparing Communion, changing the paraments - the liturgically determined stoles and covers for the Communion Table. Some visit our members in the hospital, or rehabilitation or in recovery at home.

Others re-arrange flowers from the Chancel's Sunday Service flowers and deliver them to members. They write cards of condolence, get well, birthday wishes, etc. Sunday Fellowship - the post-Sunday-Service Coffee and homemade cookies are the Deacons in the kitchen (or Publix), providing an opportunity to meet and greet others and chat.

The Deacons and Elders of our Church are elected by the members, at the Annual Congregational Meeting in January, each for a three-year term. Therefore, we shall elect four new Elders (Class of 2027) and six Deacons (Class of 2027).

The Classes of 2024 Elders (Session) and Deacons Class of 2024 (Diaconate) will rotate off. The Classes of 2027 Elders and Deacons will be ordained and installed. And the Session of twelve Elders and the Diaconate of eighteen Deacons, will carry on with their missions.
