Shawn Ginwright, a professor at Harvard, further expands on the concept of radical healing and [hope] and argues for three types of hope that create spaces of opportunities: (1) Relational Hope— changing conditions with communities based on trust and relationship. This can be found in the hope of a faithful community such as ours. 2) Restorative Hope— creating conditions and opportunities for communities to prosper and thrive. This can be realized in a church family when we are authentic in expressing the love of God. (3) "Ministerial" Hope— engaging in "Ministerial" decisions in everyday lives to articulate opportunities to flourish. This hope is expressed in the outreach, mission, and care for believers and for the community surrounding our congregation.

For the Christian, the hope we possess is bound in the truth that nothing, in all creation, can separate us from the love of God in Jesus Christ. It is this hope that empowers us to endure suffering and continue to reach out to others in concern. It is this hope that we possess, and it is this hope that will not disappoint us.

The good news is simply this; no matter what we face, no matter our struggles, no matter the difficulties that life places before us, we have hope in the power and the promises which we receive through Jesus Christ.

As we, as a congregation, face much uncertainty in the year and years to come, our hope remains in the Lord. Whatever the election may bring, whatever we face in regard to the development of a new sanctuary, whatever we experience in our personal lives, our hope is securely bound in the presence of God in our living (and in our dying).

During his career he served churches in Wheaton, Illinois, Ann Arbor, Michigan, and Fort Lauderdale, Florida. Before his retirement, he served for five years as pastor of an international congregation in Zürich, Switzerland. Doug is also the author of eight books, including his most recent book, Getting Lost to Find Ourselves: How Travel Changes Us, a reflection on travel and the ways travel changes us. Beginning with childhood road trips with his family, Doug has traveled throughout his life. He has led mission trips, pilgrimages, and study tours to countries around the world, and in recent years he has discovered the joys and challenges of walking solo along

the various Camino paths in Spain and Portugal. He has also returned twice to Europe to serve as an interim pastor to international congregations, once in Lucerne, Switzerland, and most recently in The Hague, the Netherlands.

A few of his previous books include Chasing After Wind: A Pastor's Life, Remembering the Faith: What Christians Believe, How to Become A Multicultural Church, What Am I Supposed to Do With My Life?, Beyond I Do: What Christians Believe about Marriage, and The Truth About Who We Are: A Letter to My Grandchildren. He is a frequent contributor to publications such as the Reformed Journal and the Englewood Review of Books.

Doug received his undergraduate degree from Calvin University (formerly Calvin College) and his Master of Divinity and Doctor of Ministry degrees from Princeton Theological Seminary.

His wife and frequent travel partner, Susan DeYoung, was an attorney in private practice for most of her career. She retired as executive director of Habitat for Humanity in Broward County, Florida. Doug's older daughter is a Presbyterian pastor in St. Paul, Minnesota, and his younger daughter is a health economist who lives in Seattle, Washington.

October 27th is Reformation Sunday

The beginning of our Christian faith as Presbyterian is in the Reformation Although the phrase "ecclesia reformata, semper reformanda, secundum verbum Dei" ("the church reformed, always being reformed, according to the word of God") does not originate in the Reformation, we return to it as a watchword because it is accurate to that watershed moment. In times of crisis, challenge, and conflict—then and now—God calls us to be transformed by the Word and Spirit.

As Christians, our faith began with the followers of Jesus. But the beginning of our Christian faith as Presbyterian is in the Reformation. The Reformation marks something significant for us in this part of the universal church: the coalescence of our focus on the Holy Spirit's ongoing reform of us as a church and as individuals. Martin Luther helps us to understand and acknowledge that the institution of the church is not equal to God. We are called to worship the triune God alone, to claim Jesus Christ as Lord of the church, and to seek the ongoing sanctification of the Holy Spirit.

15 October, 1954 "Music Committee "... arrangement of pews in the Chancel for the Choir ... if the singers had to sit facing each other, ... the effect when they sang would be a clashing of sounds instead of harmony. . . [however] no definite arrangement had been agreed upon by the Building Committee"

17 October,1954 [Congregational Meeting]...[A] contract to build the Sanctuary and Sunday School Room had been let ... the contractor had given his promise to have the building completed in 165 days.

The Ground-breaking Ceremony at the Church site, October 17, 1954, 12:30PM

The ceremony was conducted by Elder Harold B. Smith, the presiding officer and Elder Ray Clontz, Marshall. Earth was turned, using a gold-painted spade, Roswell C Mower, chairman of the Building Committee and representatives of the Women's Group; by Mr. J.W. Ferguson,92 years old, the oldest member of the Church. By Kay Cox, president of the newly organized Westminster Fellowship and by Andy Bill Offut, four-year-old son of Elder and Mrs. Harry Offut, Jr. At the conclusion of the Ceremony, the Minister, Rev. Ralph C. McAfee D.D. led the congregation in the repetition of the golden texts of the Gospels and the singing of the Doxology, after which he turned the final spade of earth. The congregation was dismissed by the benediction given by Dr. McAfee.
