Before, during, and after the Reformation, there has been a history of Iconoclasm. Iconoclasm is when, for religious or political significance, art is destroyed. There is a long history of the destruction of sacred art. The reasons for this are many, but at the heart of iconoclasm, is the concept that sacred and ornate art distracts believers from hearing the Word and the Word proclaimed. Good morning, thank you thanks for all you are doing.

At the time of the Reformation, and as part of our history as Presbyterians within the Christian Church, Reformed Christians have traditionally focused on more austere, simple or clear windows. The clarity of windows is to center our focus on our accurate view of the world that we are called to serve. We are to have an unencumbered view, and we are not to be distracted from seeing the world as it really exists.

Certainly, over the years, the inclusion of sacred art in the Reformed tradition has been reclaimed in favor. The example is the inclusion of our faceted glass windows in our sanctuary during the 1970s. The faceted glass windows are beautiful and add to the character and color of our congregation.

When the conceptual designs are viewed, both the narthex and the sanctuary reveal our reformed and reforming theology. Worshipers will also experience the clear windows throughout our facilities, representing our responsibility to serve the world in which we live.

In the reform tradition, we often describe ourselves as the church reformed and always reforming. This will be on clear display in our new sanctuary and narthex complex.

Your suggestions are important and they have added to the strength and character of our design. Dodgertown Reading Project and Sunset Apartments

First PresVero's Mission Team is an extremely active, broad spectrum group of members with a wide variety people and places within the Vero Beach Community.

Two of the projects for which openings have arisen are the Dodgertown Reading Project, and the residents

of the Affordable Housing units known as Sunset Apartments, on 45th Street.

Dodgertown Elementary Reading Project [https://des.indianriverschools.org/about_our_school] is a Title 1 School, which is a federally funded education program for elementary and secondary schools. Title 1 is designed to focus on special needs populations and to reduce the gap between advantaged and disadvantaged students. The program distributes funds to schools and school districts where a high percentage of students are from low-income families.

Volunteers sit with students selected by their teachers, to share a book with a helping adult, who reads to them as they both view the book. For a child, reading can be a daunting task [remember when you first learned to read?]. If that task is made more pleasant, rather than arduous, those children might be encouraged to transfer those skills in another book – or on their phones, to read – instructions, directions, information, and go on to higher levels of reading ability, which opens the world to them.

What is involved is a necessary vetting process - fingerprinting, etc. which reassures teachers and parents that their children are in safe hands.

Phil Schwin's Biography and Faith Journey as told to Phil LoGiudice



I was born in a small town in Northern Indiana in 1943 as the middle child of five kids. My family owned and operated a movie theater, and my job was running the popcorn stand. TV came along and hurt the movie business, so the theater was sold and the family moved to Deerfield Beach, Fla in 1955 where my dad started a custom kitchen cabinet business.

I graduated from Pompano Beach High School in 1961 and started college at the University of Florida. I met Barb on a blind date in 1965 (the best thing that has ever happened to me). I graduated with a B.S. in Chemical Engineering and Barb with BS in Sociology in 1967. Barb and I were married in November of 1967.

I started a 34-year career with Shell Oil Company in Baton Rouge, LA, at a Chemical Plant. Most of my career was spent in manufacturing with jobs in Baton Rouge, Houston, New Orleans, and the last four years as General

Manager of a large oil refinery in Wood River Illinois (just east of St Louis).

We adopted our son, Scott in 1972 and our daughter, Holly in 1978, and have three

grandchildren, Trey, Ella, and Tayla.

I retired in June of 2000, and we moved to Vero Beach, building a new home in Grand Harbor. Barb and I both played tennis and golf and overall enjoyed "camp life" at Grand Harbor. I also have a passion for fishing.

FAITH JOURNEY

I regularly attended the Presbyterian Church in my early years. I still belonged to the Presbyterian Church in Deerfield Beach, but attendance was sporadic partly because I worked every Sunday morning delivering newspapers and working in a small drug store. Dating Barb got me into a Baptist Church while at college, and I would say got me back on the "right track". We became very active members in a small church south of Houston called "A Uniting Church" (combination of a Presbyterian Church and United Church of Christ) where both of our kids were baptized. We were very close to the minister and his wife, and they had a significant impact on my faith journey. We belonged to churches everywhere we lived, but not quite as active as that small church in Houston.

We visited FPC in June of 2000 and heard sermons from Tim and Fred Foy Strang and decided that this was the church for us in Vero Beach. Barb got involved in church activities early and was called to be an Elder around 2005. While attending a small group session at the church studying "The Purpose Driven Life" by Rick Warren, I joked that "I would make it to heaven by accepting Christ as my Lord and Savior, but I would be digging ditches while Barb was in

Management".

In 2010 I got a call from Joann Wheeler asking me if I would consider becoming an Elder. That was a very big step in my faith journey. I filled the last two years of someone else's term on Session and then stayed on for another 3-year term. I was assigned to the Personnel Committee and the Board of Trustees. I served for those 5 years on the Board of Trustees and then added on another four years as Trustee at Large. I have remained on the personnel Committee until rotating off this year.

In 2015 I served as Chair of the Search Committee that resulted in hiring Michael York.

I have been involved in some capacity in the Building and Grounds Committee since 2011 with a focus on the HVAC in the Christian Center for Life.

I joined the Facilities Development Committee charged with building the new Sanctuary in 2024 and am currently serving as Chair. This year I was called to join the 2027 class on Session.

I believe that the very strong Christian Faith I have observed from all the folks I have worked with over years on these committees has had a significant impact on the strength of my own faith. I thank all of them along with my wife for where I am today on my own faith journey!

From the Archives 1955

March 2nd 1955 Session Meeting at the Manse.

"Offers were made by Elder Grant to furnish 35 loads of fill, Elder Amos offered the use of his tractor, disk, blade and scoop and driver to do the disking and levelling.

The matter of approving purchase of plants was held up till we could canvass members for whatever plants they could donate. . . the report also recommended a toolshed be built at the east end of the kitchen to house lawn tools. The cost of this [shed] would be \$185.00."
